Public Works

Spring Road Improvement Project:

The contractor Baldwin Paving worked this week repairing catch basin throats on the punch list. The punch list is about 75% complete.

Windy Hill Road Blvd. Project:

The demolition of 1041 Windy Hill Road is about 80% complete. Quotes for asbestos surveys have been requested for 743 and 907 Windy Hill Road.

Paving Projects:

The punch list remains at 75% complete. Bid opening is scheduled for April 17th for our next set of street paving.

Fire Station #2:

The contractor continued this week laying the block walls of the fire station building this week. The first floor block walls are now complete. Structural steel is also being placed at this time. The project remains behind schedule due to rain at this time.

Pat Mell Road Drainage Project:

The contractor worked this week and is about 50% complete.

Walker Ct. Storm Drain:

Curbing is about 90% complete with sidewalk replacement and landscaping remaining. The project is about 85% complete.

Spring Drive Curb Replacement:

The project is about 80% complete with curb work and 35% complete with landscaping.

Public Works Storm Sewer Rehab and Detention:

The contractor began this week and is clearing the area where the detention pond is to be located.
