Library

- Customer Outreach – Youth Services Library Associate, Amy Cuzzort, attended "This is Sparta" at Campbell High School on Thursday, July 27th. She spoke to 45 students about Smyrna Library's collections and services.
- Summer Reading Wrap-Up – Youth Services gave away over 1,000 books as summer reading prizes this summer. Over 600 children (babies through teens) registered for the program. The largest participation was among toddlers and preschoolers, but King Springs Elementary logged the most minutes read.

- Free Shredding Event – The next shredding event is scheduled for September 23rd, from 9:00am – 12:00pm at the Wolfe Center. We get lots of calls about this, so please help get the word out!
- Work Glove Luncheon – The annual appreciation luncheon for our incredible staff who work outdoors is scheduled for September 27th at 11:00am at the Community Center.
- Fresh Market – We have another vendor who will be bringing Georgia peaches while they last.

Public Works

- Spring Road Improvements – Baldwin Paving worked very little on their punch list items this week. Croy has sent a letter notifying Baldwin of a deadline for completion next month and liquidated damages.
- Concord Road Parking Lot – All parking lot lighting wiring is complete. Georgia Power indicates the lights are to be shipped next Wednesday.
- Glendale Place – All grassing is complete. The city landscape contractor has been asked to provide a landscape plan for the roadway and its very limited right of way.
- Windy Hill Boulevard – Purchase orders for the demolition and asbestos abatement of 629 and 751 Windy Hill Road have been requested, and notice to proceed should be issued shortly.
- Fire Station 2 – Demolition of Fire Station 2 and the old recycling center were completed this week. The building contractor indicates he is about 2-3 weeks out before they can mobilize and begin construction.
- Crew Work – Crews addressed grass cutting, sidewalk repairs along Spring Road, and landscaping and asphalt work orders this week.
- Pretty Branch to Lee Street Sewer Replacement – The contractor completed the connection this week. The lower connection at Lee Street remains. The project is about 80% complete and should be finished in about two weeks, weather permitting.
- Church Street Storm Sewer Replacement – Contractor is scheduled to start by July 31st.
- Clifton Road Storm Sewer Replacement – A purchase order has been requested for this project and notice to proceed may be issued next week.
- Sub Basin 3 Sanitary Sewer Outfall – Still under easement acquisitions and design.
- Sewer Replacement at South Cobb at Floyd – Drawings and design are complete and a permit request from Georgia DOT has been requested.
- Projects Out For Design – Sub Basin 3 Sanitary Sewer Outfall, Pat Mell Road Storm Sewer, Lake Court Park Storm Sewer, Sewer replacement on McCauley Rd, Water main replacement at South Cobb between Bank and Church Streets

- Facility Rentals – Community Center – 42; Brawner Hall – 12; Taylor-Brawner House – 1; Welcome Center – 1; Fields – 6; Pavilions – 14
- Master Plan – Perez Planning and staff are working diligently on scheduling meeting dates and interviews for stakeholders as part of the Master Plan process.
- Tolleson Pool – The pool will be operating weekends only beginning Saturday, July 29th. Admissions last week were \$4,678 and concessions were \$652.
- Smyrna Birthday Celebration – 106 tables have been sold or reserved so far.
- Various Projects – Staff is working on increasing baby changing stations in city restroom facilities. Also working on a dedicated time for special needs persons to use the Wolfe Center therapy pool.
- Parks Maintenance Highlights –
 - Fieldwork at Chuck Camp Park is completed. Fields will remain closed for the upcoming weeks to allow for the new turf to grow in.
 - Lighting for Rose Garden Basketball and Tennis Courts is out for bid. This is a CDBG-funded project, and bids are due August 11th.
 - Tolleson tennis restrooms have been repainted.
